

GDPR Statement

The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) comes into force in the UK on 25 May 2018 to enhance the protection of personal data.

Compliance with this directive is mandatory and focuses on:

- Organisations and the personal data they hold
- The purpose for which this data is held
- The consent gained to use this data
- The accuracy of this data
- The period for which this data will be held
- The protection that this data is held under

All information held and processed (collection, recording, etc.) about individuals must be accurate, consensual, purposeful and protected. Personal data is defined as information that can be used to identify an individual. Such information may include your name, employer's name, email address and other personal identifying information.

In addition, individuals whose data is held have the right for their information to be erased upon request under the right to be forgotten.
